Project-based Learning is a teaching method in which students gain knowledge and skills by working for an extended period of time to investigate and respond to an authentic, engaging and complex question, problem, or challenge.

The Exceptional Children classes are exploring the solar system. They have created a model of the solar system using balloons and soil.

Each student researched a planet, was required to write facts about their planet, and had to present the information to the class on their science board.
