Estill High School's 2016 Wall of Fame Honoree of the Week:



Rasheem Clark
Engineer
Class of 1996

Rasheem is a 1996 graduate of Estill High School. He was an outstanding sportsman in three sports to include, football, basketball, and track/field in which he won several MVP & All-Region awards throughout his sports career, Region 5A triple jump champ in 1995 & 1996, led the Gators Boys Basketball team to the 3rd round of State Basketball Playoffs, he was named Hampton County Guardian's football player of the year and Track & Field State Finalist in the 200-meter dash in 1995.

Rasheem joined the U.S. Navy after high school. In 1998 he attended ITT Technical Institute in Greenville, SC where he earned an A.S. Degree in CAD Technology. He began his professional career with J.A. Jones Construction as an Engineering CAD Technician. In 2001 he went to work for Tyco/Simplex Grinnell in Charleston, SC where he learned to engineer & design fire protection sprinkler systems. By 2005 he was hired by one of the world's largest engineering and construction firms, Fluor Corporation, in which he was a featured designer in their 2007 annual report. Rasheem now works for the U.S. Department of Energy at Savannah River Nuclear Site in the design engineering department as a Senior Designer in Aiken, SC.

In 2006 Rasheem and his wife, Lawanda Garner Clark, started a custom apparel, signs, and graphics business called T-Shirt Nation in Greenville, SC. The couple has been together since the 11th grade (21yrs) and have three children, Rasheem Tyquell Clark (20), Denesha Ramiya Clark (14), Jakiel Rashon Clark (Deceased). Since 2004, Rasheem has also been dedicating his time as a youth coach and football president with the South Greenville Wildcats Youth Organization in Greenville, SC.

He is the son of the late Margaret D. Graham of Estill, SC and the late Richard Clark of Brooklyn, NY.
