Estill High School's 2016 Wall of Fame Honoree of the Week:

Ann Goodman Family Nurse Practitioner Class of 1994



Ann Tennille Goodman is a 1994 graduate of Estill High School. Achievements during her time at EHS include academic rank as salutatorian of the EHS graduating class of 1994. She was recognized nationally among *Who's Who of American High School Students*, a member of the Beta Club, Future Homemakers of America, a varsity cheerleader and member of the EHS Marching Band, playing both the clarinet and the flute. She was also a JROTC member. She attended the South Carolina Governor's School for Math and Science Summer Academy for two years. Ann was also a recipient of the Alumni Scholarship at Clemson University.

Ann matriculated at Clemson University in Clemson, SC where she graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree. She later earned a Master of Science degree in Nursing from Walden University in Minneapolis, MN. She is a certified Family Nurse Practitioner, credentialed by the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners.

At the start of her nursing career, Ann was employed as a Staff Nurse on the Mother/Baby unit at Memorial Health University Medical Center in Savannah, GA, a regional referral center for maternal and neonatal care.

For the past 14 years, Ann has been employed as a Staff Registered Nurse and ECMO specialist in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) at Palmetto Health Richland Memorial Hospital in Columbia, SC. She has also served as a Peer Coach for the NICU. She completed the Midlands Technical Interior Design and Decorating program, and was among the first group of Midlands Tech students to be featured in the 2011 Parade of Homes in Columbia, SC.

Ann is the daughter of Edd and Annease Goodman of Furman, SC, and the granddaughter of Beulah Williams of Estill, SC.
