Message from Martin L. Wright

Greetings Hampton County School District 2 families,

COVID-19 presented an unprecedented challenge to school districts around the nation, state, and locally. Hampton County School District 2 had to appropriately organize new innovative teaching and learning methods in response to the pandemic reasonably quickly. While there was no easy answer in meeting that challenge, I was elated of how our students, parents, and teachers responded to the demands associated with COVID-19 when the distance learning and e-learning packets were implemented.

Nevertheless, we must appropriately respond to teaching and learning while thoughtfully planning for a safe return to school for both students and staff. As a learning community, students' and employees' safety will always remain our priority. In the plan, you will find we have provided guidance and strategies for all of your Back to School questions and concerns. Our Back to School plan includes information on Hybrid A/B day learning, preventing infection, transporting students, entering school buildings, serving meals, transitioning between classes, conducting large group gatherings, supporting teaching and learning, and protecting vulnerable populations.

You have spoken, and we heard the concerns shared through the parent survey. You have shared concerns about traditional face-to-face learning due to safety and concerns about distance/remote learning due to lack of teacher availability and support. Therefore, when the school year begins on Tuesday, September 8, 2020, Hampton County School District 2 will be implementing the Hybrid Learning Model. Hybrid Learning is a blended approach to instruction that uses both the Traditional model and Distance/Remote Learning. A virtual option will be available for parents through the online student registration process.

Moreover, parents are required to complete an online student registration form this year. The online student registration form is conveniently located on the Hampton District 2 webpage. The student registration form should be completed on new and returning students.

We know that returning to school while adapting to our new normal, a new type of instructional model, and a host of new procedures will be challenging for everyone in our school community. As we have done throughout this ordeal, we will work together, persevere, and ensure our students are supported in every way possible.

I want to reiterate the pride I have for our community and its response to the ongoing epidemic. The events that began to unfold in March has continued to create enormous challenges, and we as a school district are here to help support our families, staff, and community during this difficult time. Thank you always for your continued support and patience.

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Overview

This guide presents protocols developed to prevent the spread of the novel coronavirus that causes COVID-19. It is based on guidance from the Center for Disease Control, the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control, and the South Carolina Department of Education's AccelerateED Task Force.

The top priority in all decisions made by the Hampton County School District 2 is the health, safety and well-being of our students, employees and school communities. This guidance is subject to updates should conditions related to the COVID-19 pandemic changes.

Returning to School

Learning Models

Based on data collected through surveys sent to parents, teachers and staff, the district determined the need for options for the 2020–2021 school year. With this data, along with guidelines and recommendations from state and national agencies and organizations, the District has developed plans for multiple learning environments to operate. These plans are focused on protecting the health, safety and wellness of students and staff. Our goal is to provide all students the best possible learning experience that is as close to normal as health and safety allow. Hampton County School District 2 acknowledges that these plans are intended to mitigate risk. There is no single measure or plan that will completely eliminate the risk of the viral transmission; however, the implementation of several coordinated actions can reduce the risk of viral transmission.

Key considerations for determining these new learning environments:

- Health and Safety of Teachers, Students and Staff
- Impact on Families and the Community
- Academic Recovery and Acceleration
- Learning Equity and Access
- Adaptability and Readiness for Potential Emergency Closures
- Cost and Complexity of Implementation



Model 1: Traditional Schedule

In this scenario, health guidelines and facility considerations allow for all students and staff to return to a school building to open the school year *due to low or no spread of COVID-19 in the area*. From a learning perspective this should be a district's ideal scheduling scenario for the Fall, but this option can only be selected if it is possible to do so based on guidelines provided by public health authorities (DHEC and CDC) and available facilities and staffing.

Model 2: Hybrid Modeling

This situation is most likely to be experienced during a period of *medium spread of COVID-19 in the area.* In this scenario, staff and students can report to a physical school building due to a combination of health requirements and facility/space limitations. The district will consider **Alternating Days,** where cohorts of students attend school for the entire day for a portion of the week. For example, half of the students could attend school on Monday and Wednesday while the other half attend on Tuesday and Thursday. On Fridays, students engage in distance learning, teachers have opportunities for planning and grading, and districts can engage in deep cleaning of school buildings.

Model 3: Full Virtual Learning

In this scenario, all students and staff are unable to return to a physical school building due to *high spread of COVID-19 in the area*. In this event, districts should rely on a full distance learning schedule until the health situation permits a return to in-person instruction for all or part of the students in a school.

The recommended scheduling model for Hampton 2 to start the 2020-21 SY is:

1 st Choice (preferred)	Model 1	Traditional Schedule
2 nd Choice	Model 2	Hybrid (A/B Day Rotation)
3 rd Choice	Model 3	Full Virtual Learning



What will learning look like using the Hybrid & Virtual Learning Models?

With COVID-19 cases again on the rise, Hybrid scheduling is the recommended model for the district. In this model, some students will be able to report to school while others will have to engage in virtual learning using alternating days (A Day/B Day schedule) on Mondays through Thursdays. On **Fridays**:

- students will engage in distance (virtual) learning from home
- teachers will plan and grade student work, and participate in professional learning
- custodial staff will deep clean school buildings.

In the event known cases develop and our schools need to close and/or the governor directs the closing of schools due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the need for a contingency plan, all learning will follow the Full Virtual Learning Model. In this scenario, all students and staff will be unable to return to a physical school building due to high spread of COVID-19 in the area. This plan will remain in effect until the governor declares that it is safe to return to the physical school buildings. The superintendent will then communicate through One Call Now/Parent Square/Facebook/District webpage/WBHC radio message to parents/all school staff/community that it is safe to resume in-person school operations. With the Hybrid and Full Virtual Learning Models, teachers will present lessons to students for a specified amount of time as determined by each school's master schedule for each grade level and content.

Students will be assigned to the "A-Day" group or the "B-Day" group. The grouping method will be done using the school bus routing system. All schools using the A/B Day model will use the same process for group determinations. Students will be assigned to their group as soon as possible and parents will receive notification from the Office of Student Service/Transportation. This will ensure even distribution of the two groups to promote social distancing on school buses. A full virtual learning option will be available for parents to select from the online student registration. The full virtual option will operate concurrently with the hybrid model.



Hampton 2 Instructional Framework in Action

Opening Meeting



I DO

Teachers will engage in a virtual session, chat session, book sharing, video tutorial, or whatever the topic is for the day **OPENING (15 min)**

WE DO- Let's Practice Together

Teachers will then engage in sharing their screens with students and completing practice/modeling what students will do in the work session. (allow opportunities for the students to be able to interact with each other. This would require the teacher to set up some additional chat rooms/channel areas (TEAMS). Students should also be given a visual of what the final product should look like. **OPENING (15 min)**

YOU DO

Students will be demonstrating the learning and submitting the required assignment. This will help to inform instruction for the next day for the teacher. The teacher is **not** online and actively participating in the You Do (Distance Learning Model only).

WORK SESSION

As students submit their work using the Microsoft Teams, this will help to inform instruction for the next day for teachers. Teachers will then be able to review/grade work session assignments, provide real time feedback, and use this formative check to plan learning for the next day. The posting of the lesson will provide a means of access for the parent and/or students to review the learning concepts and see the modeling done by the teacher.



Hampton District 2 Instructional Framework in Action Cont.

CLOSING (15 min)

The teacher will summarize and then close the lesson.

- Models providing feedback using language of the standards
- Formatively assess student understanding
- Explicitly clarify misconceptions
- Restate the standard
- The teacher will post the live lesson session via Microsoft Teams and Parent Square for parent/student access. Students will then be responsible for completing the assignment from the lesson.



Expectations for Student Learning

Students are the most essential key to ensure that learning takes place each day through both virtual and in-person instruction. The list below represents expectations for learning. This list is expected to be followed by all students in Hampton County School District 2. The expectations are as follows:

- Ensure that you know your username and password for all online learning and assessment platform, Microsoft Office 365, and login for device access.
- Check daily posting from your teacher(s). Expectations for the day should be posted by 8:00 a.m. the day class is meeting so that students and/or families don't need to continue to check back throughout the day for additional posts.
- Students need to complete learning activities for each class by the date identified by the teacher.
- Respond to any teacher email or question on assignments within 24 hours, Monday-Friday
- Establish a good workspace at home (Separate space, clean and organized, have all the tools/items you need, distractions set aside, etc.)
- Be sure to follow the set norms and participation expectations established by your teachers. The teacher will utilize the Effort Rubric to assess your participation. Participation will count toward 20% of the student's grade.
- Expectations for student interaction virtually with students and staff is the same expectation as if in the classroom
- Proper behavior and interaction with each other online is necessary. We expect the BEST from students at all times.
- Your teacher may be including videos, notes, & PowerPoint slide of materials to help you learn the content such as:
 - Written assignments, online quizzes, reading, or other work to be completed mostly independently may be included.
 - This may include live check-in via video or text chat during scheduled available time per class.
 - Videos or screencasts may be posted of presentations, explanations, etc.
 - Students may be asked to record themselves -- for language, talking through math problems, reading for fluency and comprehension, doing physical activity, music lessons, art projects, etc.
 - You will also be using additional features linked on the main course navigation that are useful in an online learning environment such as chat, collaborations and additional use of the Calendar for scheduling time during your teacher's office hours. Please reach out to your teachers, counselors, principals/assistant principals should you need extra support with your academics, workload or need to connect with an adult.

Special Education/EL/504 Expectations

Student receiving specialized instruction such as a learner with an IEP, English Language Learner or 504 plans will continue to be provided with appropriate instructional services. IEPs will be amended, as needed, to reflect the instructional delivery model chosen by the parent so that appropriate special education and related services, supports, accommodations, and modifications are designed to provide meaningful educational benefit (FAPE) in the least restrictive environment.



Health and Safety Protocols

Disease Metrics and Categories for Spread Guidance Provided by DHEC

Two – week Incidence Rate: the number of new cases in the prior two weeks (June 29 - July 12, 2020) per 100,000 people. This metric provides the recent incidence of COVID-19 infections in that county. Categorization (# cases/100,000 people):

• Low:0-50

• Medium: 51 – 200

• High: ≥ 201

Trend in Incidence Rate: whether the two-week incidence rate is *increasing, decreasing, or stable* compared to the previous two weeks. For purposes of this assessment, consider the trends to be equivalent to:

Decreasing = Low

• Stable = Medium

• Increasing = High

Two-Week Percent Positive Rate: the percentage of individuals who tested positive out of the number of individuals tested with a molecular (swab, or PCR) test in the last two weeks for each county. The metric takes into consideration the number of tests performed for residents of the county in the previous two weeks. Categorization:

• Low: ≤ 5.0%

Medium: 5.1% - 9.9%

• High: ≥ 10.0%

If the rates are the same categorizations, that is the overall assessment.

If the rates are not the same categorization, take the average of them.

- Incidence Rate = Medium
- Trend in Incidence Rate = Low
- Percent Positive Rate = Medium

There are two metrics that are Medium and One that is Low, so the disease activity level overall Medium.



Health and Safety Protocols for Teachers and Staff

Employee Enhanced Guidelines:

- Before and after eating, wash hands thoroughly with soap and water.
- Do not eat in groups if you are not six feet apart.
- Re-apply masks after lunch if social distancing is not possible.
- Staff must wipe down commonly touched items used throughout the workday.
- Remember to use proper hand hygiene before and after removing cloth face covering.
- Custodians will implement Enhanced Safety Cleaning Protocols for cleaning, sanitizing and disinfecting surfaces and areas.




Health and Safety Protocols for Student Nutrition

HCSD2 student nutrition employees will continue to prepare food in our school kitchens following very strict food safety and sanitation procedures as required by the USDA, OSHA and SC DHEC.

What will look different this year:

- Elementary School students will receive their meals in the classroom.
- Middle School and High School students will pick up their lunch from a designated area and eat in the classroom.
- Meals will be provided for students on days when they are not physically attending inperson instruction. These meals will be made available for distribution by the Office of Student Service/Transportation.
- Bottled Water will be available at all times for all students.
- Meals will be served using disposable plates and utensils.





Health and Safety Protocols for Transportation

More information regarding transportation routes and stops will be provided once data collection on number of students has been analyzed. The Office of Student Services/Transportation will provide parents with information pertaining to routes and schedules for all bus riders.

In order to meet CDC Guidelines, the following will be observed:

- Social distancing will be observed while transporting students to and from school. Seating arrangement (Six-foot distancing)
- Each student's temperature will be checked prior to boarding the bus.
- Students are required to wear masks for the entire trip.
- Siblings will be seated together
- Student isolation will be observed in the event that a child has a temperature.

State Guidelines

Under state guidelines, buses will operate at roughly 50 percent capacity for each route. Due to this guideline, the District is encouraging parents to provide student transportation, if possible, to allow for quicker transport of students who may not have another option.

Bus Registration

In order to ride a school bus for the 2020-2021 school year, a registration form must be completed prior to August 17, 2020. A bus registration form will be made available for parents to complete beginning the week of August 3, 2020. Please go to the district's website to access.

Safety and Cleaning Protocols

Each bus will be cleaned and disinfected using a electrostatic sprayer with an EPA approved disinfectant a minimum of twice per day following the completion of morning and afternoon routes. Each bus will be sanitized (in accordance with CDC guidelines) between each trip.



Health and Safety Protocols for Custodial Services

The Hampton County School District 2 utilize its custodial services for all schools and facilities.

- Over the summer, all schools have been thoroughly cleaned and disinfected carpets cleaned, floors scrubbed and waxed, equipment sanitized and restrooms disinfected from ceiling to floor.
- All classrooms, restrooms, cafeterias, media centers, hallways, offices and any other space in the school building that is occupied will be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected prior to the arrival of students and faculty and again after the departure of all occupants at the end of every school day.
- Routine cleaning and disinfecting will occur during the school day of all objects to include but not limited to desks, chairs, door knobs, sink handles, countertops and light switches that are frequently touched.
- Disinfectant wipes that are EPA approved will be provided for use ontablets, touch screens, keyboards, remote controls and other high touch surfaces.
- Hand sanitizer will be provided in each classroom and readily available around all buildings in multiple locations.
- All playground equipment will be cleaned and disinfected after each recess schedule. All
 outside athletic facilities will be cleaned and disinfected daily.
- All water fountains will be turned off and water bottle filling stations will be provided.
- At night after initial cleaning and disinfecting has been completed, a team of Disinfectant Technicians will spray each school with a spray mister machine containing a disinfectant on the N-List from the EPA for COVID-19.
- Each bus shall be cleaned and disinfected using a electrostatic sprayer with an EPA approved disinfectant twice per day following the completion of morning and afternoon routes.
- Frequent wipe downs with a disinfectant cleaner on the N-List from the EPA for COVID-19 will be performed on bus high touch surfaces including but not limited to the entrance handrails, areas touched by the driver, seats and seat backs.



Health and Safety Protocols for Maintaining Healthy Spaces

Social Distancing

All schools and facilities are taking actions to ensure all campus spaces support health and safety. These actions include signage and floor markings to remind students of social-distancing practices. There may be some changes to foot-traffic flow through buildings and furniture placement in the classrooms. The District recognizes that some parents of students with complex medical needs will have additional concerns. Students with disabilities and employees who work with them are expected to practice social distancing when possible.

Face Coverings

The district will require the use of face coverings for students and staff. The district is providing a face covering to all staff and will provide a face covering for any student who cannot provide their own. The district may also install Plexiglas shields at student seating in classes where class sizes may limit social distancing options. These measures are being implemented in an effort to promote a safe and healthy learning environment for our students and staff.

Handwashing

The CDC recommends everyone wash their hands often with soap and water for 20 seconds. Schools will be incorporating handwashing breaks into the school day and reinforcing handwashing during key times throughout the school day. If your child has sensitivities to hand sanitizer, please communicate this with your child's teacher and school nurse so they can provide your child other opportunities to clean their hands.

Hand-Sanitizing Stations

Hand sanitizer will be provided in each classroom and readily available throughout all buildings.



Health and Safety Protocols Maintaining Healthy Spaces

Visitors

In an effort to protect the health and safety of our community, only essential visitors will be allowed on school campuses to minimize the number of people on-site. No outside guests will be allowed to visit the classroom or during lunch time. All efforts will be made to keep necessary visitors to a minimum, including the use of virtual or telephone meetings with families and guests. Parents meeting on-site with school staff must follow social-distancing guidelines and wear masks when appropriate.

Athletic and Co-Curricular Activities

The District will follow the South Carolina High School League's phased re-entry plan for athletics and follow all district Operational Health and Safety Protocols for extra-curricular activities.

Athletes, Coaches, and Staff should be screened by a health care professional or designated full time district/school employee. We will exclude from participation anyone who answers YES to any of the following questions:

- Have had a fever of 100.4°F or greater in the last 2 days;
- Have a cough, difficulty breathing, sore throat, or loss of taste or smell;
- Had contact with a person known to be infected with COVID-19 within the previous 14 days;
- Have compromised immune systems and/or have chronic diseases.

Additional guidance:

- All practice will be done in small groups.
- Face coverings that completely cover the nose and mouth shall be required for everyone.
- Athletes should wear face covering when not actively participating in the sports activity.
- Face coverings should not be shared, and non-disposable face coverings should be cleaned daily.
- Coaches and Staff shall wear face covering at all times.
- Use of locker rooms, and/or offices are prohibited.
- Fans will be required to observe CDC guidelines regarding social distancing at all times.
- A face covering (mask) is required at all events.



Health and Safety Protocols Maintaining Healthy Spaces

Athletic and Co-Curricular Activities cont.

- Alcohol-based hand sanitizers or adequate hand washing facilities are provided for use by all attendees.
- For the first two weeks there will be no building usage for football athletes.
- Building will be used sparingly (Mainly for volleyball)
- Football will work predominantly outdoors utilizing the practice, main, and rear parking area for workouts
- Volleyball athletes will utilize the back doors as entrance and exit via the side doors of the gym.
- Athletes, coaches and staff should come dressed for participation or practice.
- Athletes should bring their own water bottles. (No sharing due to COVID-19)

Field Trips

For the upcoming school year, in-person field trips have been suspended to ensure the safety of our students and staff. The District does encourage virtual field trips.

Vocational Rehabilitation

- Depending on student numbers, students will be transported by bus or van.
- Students will adhere to the CDC guideline of practicing social distancing.
- Students and driver must wear their masks at all times.
- Both the students and driver temperature checked before leaving and after returning to school.



Health and Safety Protocols Social and Emotional Health

The volume of information in the media and elsewhere about COVID-19 can cause concern for parents and students. Here are some tips to help address your family's social and emotional needs:

- Share age-appropriate information with students and correct misinformation.
- Reassure children that they are safe and that adults are working to keep them safe.
- Emphasize ways children and families can be "germ-busters" and reduce the spread of illness.
- Try to keep routines as normal as possible.
- Limit the amount of exposure to television and social media regarding COVID-19.

Our schools are thoughtfully planning how to support all students' mental and emotional well-being upon their return to school by implementing socio-emotional learning curriculum.

If you have concerns about your student, please contact your student's school counselor.



Guidelines for Identifying COVID-19 Symptoms Students and Staff

One or more of the following symptoms

- Fever (100.0)
- Trouble breathing or shortness of breath
- Loss of taste or smell

Two or more of the following symptoms

- Sore throat
- Chills
- Muscle aches
- New or worsening cough
- Nausea
- Diarrhea

Procedures if a student/staff member is exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19

- Student or staff member will immediately be provided a mask and will report to the school isolation room.
- Parents will be contacted to pick up their child within an hour.
- Staff member or parents will be recommended to contact their healthcare provider to see if testing is needed. Staff members are required to report test results immediately to supervisor. Parents will be required to report test results to the school's data specialist prior to the student's return to school.
- All devices used by a person that is sick will be cleaned and disinfected before further use.

The school/district will report any case of COVID-19 to local health departments, staff, and school families.



Guidelines for Returning to School

Following Exposure or Symptoms

- A student or staff member that thinks/knows that they have COVID-19 can return to school if they meet ALL of the following criteria:
 - It has been 10 calendar days since symptoms began
 - No fever (without fever reducing medicine) or other symptoms for 3 calendar days
- A student or staff member that is showing symptoms but refuses a COVID-19 test may return to school if they meet ALL of the following criteria:
 - It has been 10 calendar days since symptoms began
 - No fever (without fever reducing medicine) or other symptoms for 3 calendar days
- A student or staff member that tests positive for COVID-19, but does not have any of the symptoms listed above, can return to school if they meet ALL of the following criteria:
 - It has been 10 calendar days since the positive test result
 - Has continued to have no symptoms
- A student or staff member exhibiting symptoms (not exposed) may return to school with negative test results or a doctor's note stating that a medical evaluation determined that their symptoms were due to another cause. The student must still abide by all health regulations for the cause of the symptoms.
- A student/staff member that has been exposed (within six feet for more than 10 minutes without a mask) to another person (family, friend, other student) that has tested positive with COVID-19 must follow the criteria below:
 - Quarantine for 14 calendar days after the last exposure
 - Monitor symptoms of COVID-19
 - If exhibiting symptoms or tests positive, then a student or staff member must follow those guidelines to return to school.



Guidelines for Exposure or Closure

Guidelines for Exposure in School (Based on SCDHEC Guidelines)

Elementary

- Student who is sick will remain home for 10 calendar days from first sign of symptoms and must be without fever (without fever reducing medicine) or other symptoms for three calendar days.
- The school will monitor remaining students' daily temperature and symptoms for two weeks.
- Students in the class will wear masks when unable to social distance.
- If 20% of the class displays symptoms of COVID-19, the class will move to virtual learning for 10 school days.

Middle/High School

- Student who is sick will remain home for 10 calendar days from first sign of symptoms and must be without fever (without fever reducing medicine) or other symptoms for three calendar days.
- Administration and school nurse will work with local health officials to determine exposure risk to other students/staff.
- If 20% of the class displays symptoms of COVID-19, the class will move to virtual learning for 10 school days.

Guidelines for Closure of Schools (Based on SCDHEC Guidelines)

The following conditions will prompt immediate school closure:

- If a classroom has 20% or more of the student population test positive for COVID-19 within a two-week period OR if a building has 10% or more of the total student enrollment test positive for COVID-19 within a two-week period.
- For any positive COVID-19 case at a school in the Hampton County School District 2, the district and school leadership teams will work with local officials from the Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) in determining a course of action on a case-bycase basis.




Health Screening Responsibilities Students

Important Definitions

<u>Quarantine</u> – This is used to separate people who are in close contact of someone with a contagious for a period of time (14 calendar days for COVID-19) to see if they become sick.

<u>Isolation</u> - The act of remaining at home or a place where a person was told to isolate and avoid contact with other people until their isolation period is over. Isolation is recommended for those who are sick with symptoms of COVID-19 and have tested positive or are waiting on results of a test.

<u>Close Contact</u> - This is defined as being within 6 feet of someone who tested positive for COVID-19 for at least several minutes (usually about 10 minutes).



Communication



The purpose of the communication plan is to present a clear and concise framework for communicating with our school community. The plan primarily addresses two types of school district stakeholder:

- Internal stakeholders (students, staff, administration and Board of Trustees) and
- External stakeholders (parents, business partners, civic groups, faith-based organizations, and other members of the Hampton community).
