#### "Renaissance Star 360"

- includes interim assessments for early literacy, math, and reading (also available in Spanish), helping you determine the best instruction to meet the needs of all students.
- scaled score (SS) is useful for comparing student performance over time and across grades.
- grade equivalent (GE) score indicates the grade placement of students for whom a particular score. is typical. If a student receives a GE of 10.7, this means that the student is at the seventh month of grade 10.
- Lexile Framework assesses both sides of reading development: the reader and the material being read. When a student chooses texts 100L below to 50L above his or her reported Lexile reader measure, a targeted reading experience can occur. The Lexile reader measure describes an individual's reading ability.
- Test are given 3 times a year: Fall, Winter, and Spring. •
