- Students will practice words during Station Rotation (Word Study, during whole-group Phonics/Phonemic Awareness, Do-Now, etc.) in whatever way teacher chooses...sample sheets will be provided for those who need fun ideas.
- Spelling words will be placed on weekly newsletter or homework sheets for home practice as well.
- All students will take a spelling test (orally or on paper), in which the top three spellers will be recorded each week.
- The recorded names will be utilized to determine who will be competing in the grade-level and ultimately: School-Wide Spelling Bee on Literacy Night.




